Before discussing roles of police in dealing with CCL let's recall who is CCL.

Section 2 (13) of the JJ Act, 2015, says a 'child in conflict with law' means a child who is alleged or found to have committed an offence and who has not completed 18 years of age on the date of commission of such offence.
